

The "VAN GOGH:UP CLOSE" exhibit at the Philadelphia Museum of Art welcomed the Teditor and his intrepid "Cob-reporters" on Wednesday. This on Wednesday. This exhibit was unique in that many of the paintings displayed were from private collections giving Van Gogh fans an opportunity to view work they'd probably never before seen. Narrated by actual museum curators via audio headsets, the information unique to each painting was spiced up with quotations from actual letters from Vincent sent to his brother, Theo. The show was colorful beyond words, extremely informative, and, as usual, always a bit melancholy. For me, Van Gogh's anguish and loneliness are ever-present in his work. Even his most vibrant landscapes and florals belie the personal turmoil that Vincent dealt with for most of his short 37 years. He never realized the enormous success his paintings would achieve or the impact he would have on the world. Van Gogh would be dumb-struck to see the thousands who pay homage to him by attending his exhibits and adoring his work. I really hope that somewhere, somehow Vincent knows. =^..^= kz



**A Special night** to look is Saturday, Feb. 25th, when the crescent Moon moves in to form a slender heavenly triangle with Venus, Jupiter and the Moon as vertices (sky map). One night later, on Sunday, Feb. 26<sup>th</sup>, it happens again (sky map). This arrangement will be visible all around the world, from city and countryside alike. The Moon, Venus and Jupiter are the brightest objects in the night sky; together they can shine through urban lights, fog, and even some clouds.
