



Ted Corbett traces the Revolutionary era in New Castle

In June 1774, New Castle's Green was the site of open rebellion, as citizens gathered to protest the actions of the Crown. From the raising of militia to the signing of the Declaration of Independence, New Castle became Delaware's leader in supporting the Revolution. Yet this was truly a civil war that divided families, friends and



churches, and when General Howe and his British army invaded in 1777, they found many Loyalists to welcome them. It begins with the earliest protests through the invasion by the British and the subsequent harassment from Royal Navy and loyalist raiders to the community's role in the new republic and its support of the French Revolution.

Last week, at the spring equinox, we tried standing eggs on end. So, now let's cook those that didn't break! And, let's something a little different.

Let's crack eggs into veggies, using them as "ring molds" for the eggs in the skillet. Yes, indeed. Check out our Flower Power Eggs and Eggs in Avocado Slices.

Onion slices make a nice egg mold! This is a great version of the eggs in veggie ring molds - sautéed onions are so delicious, and give a nice tang to the eggs. And they are, of course, beautiful on a plate!

Slice your onion into 1/2 inch slices. Then, using the biggest one, place in an oiled skillet over medium heat. When one side is lightly browned, flip the onion ring over and crack an egg in the middle. If you want the egg yolk to show, dab the top of the egg yolk gently with a paper towel and remove the white over the top of it. Then, sprinkle a little water in the pan and cover the skillet. Cook until your egg is done as you like.

Now just sprinkle with kosher salt and cracked black, and sit back and wait for the raves!

hocolate

Makes: 10 servings • Prep Time: 20 minutes Bake Time: 45 minutes • Level: Easy

2 loaves banana bread, cut into 1/2-inch cubes (10 cups, loosely packed) 2 cups heavy cream 12 ounces semisweet or bittersweet chocolate, finely chopped

2 cups half-and-half

- 2 tbsps brown sugar
- 2 tbsps rum
- 2 tsps vanilla extract
- 2 large eggs
- 3 large egg yolks

Make the pudding: Preheat oven to 300° F

Fill 10 6-ounce oven-safe ramekins with the banana bread cubes and set aside. In a medium-sized saucepan bring the cream to a simmer. Turn off the heat and add the chocolate. Swirl the pot gently so the chocolate is completely covered by the cream, cover the pot and let sit for 3 minutes. Whisk the cream and chocolate together until smooth. Add the half-and-half, brown sugar, rum and vanilla. In a separate bowl, whisk together the eggs and yolks. Add the eggs to the chocolate mixture and mix until combined.

Place the ramekins on a cookie sheet. Slowly ladle the chocolate mixture over the banana bread.

You will want to gently push the cubes into the chocolate, so that the bread will absorb the chocolate. Fill the ramekins nearly to the top.

Bake for about 45 minutes, or until the chocolate is set firm on the edges, but the center is still a little soft.

Remove from the oven and allow to sit for 15 minutes before serving. They can be served warm, at room temperature or chilled. You can also reheat them for about 30 seconds in the microwave or 10 minutes in a 350° F oven.

Top with unsweetened crème fraiche at brunch or with your favorite ice cream for dessert.



NC Historical Society

The Delaware Public Archives has launched an exciting new internet research tool. Known as the Collection Gateway, this new feature searches the databases of nineteen different collections in the Archives, opening a treasure trove of information for historians, genealogists, and all citizens who have an interest in finding Delaware information online. Among the collections now searchable online are

Church records, Orphans Court records, Newspapers, Maps, Coroners Reports, Probates Reports, and Apprentice Indentures. Through the Collection Gateway, researchers can explore the wealth of historical resources that are stored at the Delaware Public Archives.

Because not all the information was extracted, the Gateway gives only a glimpse into the full record. Once a detail page for the document has been reached, it will be possible to e-mail a request for the full record to the Delaware Public Archives. With this request, the Archives staff can pull the record and send a reply with a link to shop.delaware.gov to purchase a copy. To view the original record, it is strongly recommended that patrons visit the Mabel Lloyd Ridgely Research



A timeline of New Castle City History compiled by the New Castle Historical Society

- 1651 Fort Casimir established at today's New Castle by the Dutch under Gov. Peter Stuyvesant.
- 1682 William Penn landed in New Castle to take control of the colony of Pennsylvania.
- 1704 Penn granted Lower Three Counties (today's Delaware) independent status, with New Castle as their capital.
- 1764 First Board of Trustees of New Castle Common named to manage common land for residents.
- 1776 New Castle became the state capital, but the state moved its governmental seat to Dover the following year.

1824 - New Castle was devastated by the Great Fire on Water Street, now known as The Strand.
