New Orleans Mardi Gras began in 1837, the year of the first street parade. The first day of the Carnival season is always January 6th (which is twelve days after Christmas). This is called the Twelfth Night and marks the beginning of the private masked balls that are held until Mardi Gras Day. The Mardi Gras parades consist of floats holding the krewe members, who throw doubloons, beads and other items to the people lining the streets. Many "parade-goers"either wear a costume or purple, green and gold when attending the parades, and scream "Throw me somethin' Mister!" to the krewe members on the floats.

There will be **'Jig Dancing'** in Historic New Castle. Wed. 3/16, St. Patrick's Eve. Two, three member teams – one all male, the other female – have accepted the challenge to see which team can fabricate the "Best Jig Dancer." They will meet at 6 p.m. at **"Traders Cove"** at 206 Delaware Street.

Each competitor will be issued an unpainted, wooden jig doll, and in the space of 60 minutes they will be expected to paint and decorate each doll individually, so it depicts occupations as different from one another as leprechauns to lawyers.

Break time will consist of a Traders Cove snack, including some Guinness! Then the competition! It looks to be an interesting evening...*hope you will join us and congratulate the winner!*

Combine all ingredients except the club soda to a chilled mixer and shake well for at least one minute. Strain into a highball glass filled with ice and then top off the glass with a splash of soda (this should create the "fizz"). Serves 1. Henry C. Ramos, a saloon owner in New Orleans circa 1900, invented the Ramos Gin Fizz. He said the drink was to be equated with "drinking a flower." Ever since then it has been a popular New Orleans classic.

Fill a Collins glass with ice and add the Pimms and the lemonade. Then top off with 7up and garnish with a cucumber. Serves 1.

A Pimms Cup is a mild-tasting summertime drink made with Pimms liqueur, sometimes described as a cross between a Vodka Collins and a <u>Mint Julep</u>. The Pimms Cup is a very sweet and refreshing drink that is very popular in New Orleans, especially during the hot summer months.

My Grammies Original Toll House Cookies

Cream $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Butter or other shortening with 6 tbsp granulated sugar with 6 tbsp brown sugar. Add 1 egg (well beaten) \cdot 1 1/8c sifted flour, $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp baking powder or baking soda, $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp hot water. Last add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped English Walnuts and 1 pkg. Nestles 'semi-sweet' chocolate morsels, $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp vanilla. Drop by $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoons on a greased cookie sheet Bake 10 - 12 minutes in 350° - 325° oven Makes 50 cookies

The CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE

was accidentally developed by <u>Ruth Graves</u> <u>Wakefield</u> in 1930. She owned the <u>Toll House</u> <u>Inn, in Whitman, Massachusetts</u>, a very popular restaurant that featured home cooking in the 1930s. The restaurant's popularity was not just due to its home-cooked style meals; her policy was to give diners a whole extra helping of their entrées to take home with them and a serving of her homemade cookies for dessert. Her cookbook, **Toll House Tried and True Recipes**, was published in 1936 by M. Barrows & Company, <u>New York</u>. It included the recipe "Toll House Chocolate Crunch Cookie", which rapidly became a favorite to be baked in American homes.
