Steal This Recipe®

Asparagus Soup

Stolen with permission from Chef Stephan Putnam of the newly opened Italian restaurant **Lido**, in Harlem, New York, this simple recipe is a delicious way to use fresh spring asparagus.

8 -10 servings.



ASPARAGUS SOUP INGREDIENTS

4 oz butter

1/4 celery root (peeled and sliced)

½ onion (sliced)

½ leek (sliced)

1 sprig thyme (leaves only)

1 oz garlic

1 bay leaf

2 quarts asparagus ends (peeled)

4 quarts chicken stock

2½ oz Wondra flour, or instant

flour

2 potatoes

1/4 cup cooked spinach for color

Nutmeg to taste

Salt to taste

Pepper to taste

INSTRUCTIONS

In a large rondo or roasting pan, sauté the celery root, onions, leeks, garlic, and herbs.

Add the flour and cook for 5 minutes until the onions and leeks are translucent.

Add the asparagus, chicken stock and potatoes.

and potatoes. Cook covered over a low heat for 1 to $1 \frac{1}{2}$ hours.

Puree the mixture in blender – adding the spinach for color, if needed.

Strain through a fine chinoise or strainer.

Season with nutmeg, salt and pepper.

Potatoes sometimes get a bad health rap. But new research shows that certain varieties may help quiet inflammatory processes that set the stage for disease.

Specifically, researchers recently sang the praises of potatoes with yellow flesh -- like **Yukon Gold**. In a small study of men, eating a cup of yellow potatoes every day for 6 weeks helped lower blood levels of interleukin-6 (IL-6), a compound that promotes inflammation.

Inflammation Overload

Inflammatory cycles go something like this: First, free radicals in your body -- generated by stress, illness, pollutants, and normal everyday body processes -- start to damage cells and tissues. In response, your

body releases IL-6 to help corral and neutralize some of those free radicals. But chronically high levels of IL-6 can up your risk of inflammation-related diseases. Enter, potatoes. Research suggests that antioxidants in yellow potatoes -- like phenols and carotenoids -- may help fight the out-of-control inflammation that makes you susceptible to a wide range of illnesses, from heart disease to cancer. (Are you getting enough of this inflammation-fighting vitamin?)

Top Tater

Purple Potatoes seemed to be beneficial, too. Russian Blue as <u>purple potatoes</u>. This type is great for all kind of dishes because they are usually "medium" in starch.

In the study, adult men up to age 40 ate a cup of boiled potatoes every day for 6 weeks. The men who ate yellow potatoes had lower levels of IL-6 and exhibited less DNA damage compared with the men who ate white potatoes. Purple-potato eaters had lower levels of a different inflammatory marker, C-reactive protein, compared with white-potato eaters. Researchers suspect the rich pigments in colored potatoes help protect cells, tissue, and DNA from the free radical injuries that initiate inflammation. Read about additional uses that <u>raw potatoes</u> have.

Sacred battle ground remain intact

Gettysburg Casino Plan Denied

The die has been cast. There will be no casino in Gettysburg, Pa. This morning, the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board voted 6-1 to award a gaming license to Nemacolin Woodlands Resort near Pittsburgh, and not to Gettysburg businessman David LeVan, who wanted to build a casino a halfmile south of Gettysburg National Military Park.

"This is the right decision for the people of Adams County, and for the millions of Americans who believe in protecting the sacred sites that tell us who we are as a nation," Stephanie Meeks, president of the National Trust for Historic Preservation said in a statement. "When President Lincoln dedicated the Gettysburg Battlefield in 1863, he ensured that this ground would remain sacred soil, a place for the entire nation to visit and remember the sacrifices made on the battlefield."

About 50 people from the grassroots group No Casino Gettysburg awaited the board's decision this morning at the State Museum in Harrisburg, according to Mindy Crawford, executive director of Preservation Pennsylvania. "We weren't entirely sure how it was going to come out. As soon as the final vote was cast, the No Casino group jumped to their feet and

applauded and cheered," Crawford says.

Documentary filmmaker Ken Burns and historian David McCullough, along with tens of thousands of petition-signers, had objected to LeVan's casino



proposal, and four groups formed a coalition against it: Preservation Pennsylvania, the National Trust for Historic Preservation, the Civil War Trust, and the National Parks Conservation Association.

"This is a great day, not just for Gettysburg, but for all historic sites," says Jim Campi, president of the Civil War Trust. "However, we must remember that this proposal was just a symptom of a larger problem—the <u>numerous</u> irreplaceable sites similarly besieged by ill-considered development."

This is the second time LeVan's proposal for a casino in Gettysburg has been denied. In 2005, preservationists and residents led a grassroots effort to defeat a similar proposal.

"We hope today's decision lays to rest, once and for all, the idea of placing a casino so close to this important historic site," Meeks said. "We are proud to share in this victory with our many partners." Historic Preservation
