Classic T-Birds coming to town July 12th



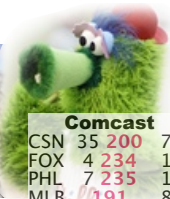
A rare opportunity to see the classics will take place on **Thurs., July 12th** at 11am when the **Thunderbirds** will be in Historic New Castle.

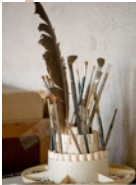

Vanilla Ice Cream

WITH

Simply Fabulous Espresso Sauce

If you can boil water, you can make this very simple, totally luscious coffee sauce. We use instant espresso for its convenience and speed, but 1 cup (8 ounces) of freshly brewed espresso works just as well, and tastes divine.

This recipe makes 8 servings and doubles easily.

ingredients

- 1 cup water
- 2 tbsps instant espresso
- 2 pints vanilla ice cream
- 2 tbsps top quality dark chocolate, finely chopped, (Valrhona or similar) with extra for decoration

directions

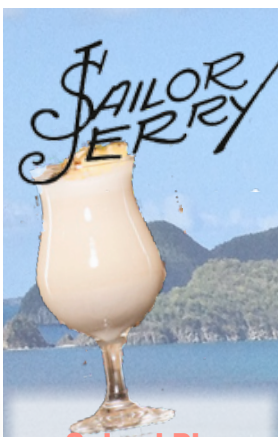
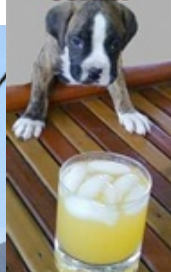


In a small saucepan, bring the cup of water to a boil. Add the water to the instant espresso, stir until dissolved.

Add 1 tsp of the dark chocolate pieces and stir with a wooden spoon until they dissolve.

Place a scoop of the vanilla ice cream in each of eight cups or small bowls. Drizzle the sauce over the ice cream and sprinkle the remaining chocolate. Serve immediately.

Spiced Pina Colada

- 2 parts Sailor Jerry
- 1 part coconut cream or Monin Coconut
- 1 part cream
- 1 part fresh pineapple juice
- 2 dashes Angostura bitters:

Blend ingredients with one scoop of ice
Garnish with a pineapple wedge



Tiki Swizzle

- 3 parts Sailor Jerry
- 2 parts pineapple juice

- 1 part Port
- 1 part simple syrup
- 1 part fresh lime juice
- 2 dashes Peychaud bitters
- 2 dashes Angostura bitters

Combine ingredients, shake and strain over (crushed) ice OR Combine ingredients in glass, add crushed ice and "swizzle" top with ice. Either way, garnish with a pineapple piece and paper umbrella

grill that salad

Summer means lighting up that grill and preparing all that meat. Since you have all that fire, why not grill your salad too? Here's a great recipe for a **Grilled Romaine Salad with Sliced Seasonal Apple, Smoked Bacon with Gorgonzola Dressing.**

The Gorgonzola Dressing is made from scratch but boy is it easy - and all natural too! **Teditor** recommends that this salad is served with a 8 oz. New York Steak... grilled of course. (see below)

Salad Ingredients:

- 1 head of romaine, heart only, cut in half lengthwise
- 1 Tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 2 slices apple wood-smoked bacon, cooked until crisp ▲ 1/4 apple (in season), cored and thinly sliced
- 3 Tbsp gorgonzola dressing

Gorgonzola Dressing Ingredients:

- 2.5 oz buttermilk ▲ 2 oz sour cream ▲ 2 oz crumbled gorgonzola cheese ▲ 1/2 clove garlic, peeled and minced ▲ 1/2 tsp lemon juice ▲ Salt and pepper to taste ▲ Stir all ingredients together until well-combined. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Keep chilled until service. **Teditor says buy a jar in the supermarket!!!**

Grilled Romaine Salad Instructions:

- Brush the romaine halves with olive oil and season with salt and pepper.
- Place them cut side down on a gas grill for about 30 seconds. You will see grill marks and the leaves will be slightly singed.
- Arrange the halves on a plate together with the apple and bacon slices.
- Drizzle the Gorgonzola Dressing over the top and serve.



Grill it...and they will come

- 1 Clean and pre-heat your grill on high.
- 2 Lightly oil and season everything before you put it on the grill. This helps the searing process and prevents sticking.
- 3 Sear the outside of the steaks when grilling, using tongs or a spatula to turn the meat, and cover the grill as much as possible during the grilling process to help lock in the great flavor and to prevent flare-ups. Never pierce the steak when grilling as that allows the flavorful juices to escape. Don't press or squish the steaks or burgers when grilling either. Just let them be!
- 4 Use the 60/40 grilling method. Grill for 60% of the time on the first side, then grill 40% of the time after you turn over the food. This will give you an evenly cooked product.
- 5 Place your cooked meats on a clean plate and allow your foods to "rest" for two to five minutes before serving to retain moisture and juiciness.

Most steaks don't take very long to cook on the grill, so be careful to avoid overcooking. You can always put a steak back on the fire, but it's hard to correct an overdone steak disaster.

Fort Casimir in New Castle.

The trench below was designed to run perpendicular to any possible fortification lines and was based on Ned and Louise Heite's unit ER6. Then the City of New Castle provided a backhoe with an expert operator who carefully sliced through the industrial fill in the east trench. Right, Pete Leach is explaining the stratigraphy to our frequent visitors, and Lu Ann is drawing a profile on ER6.
