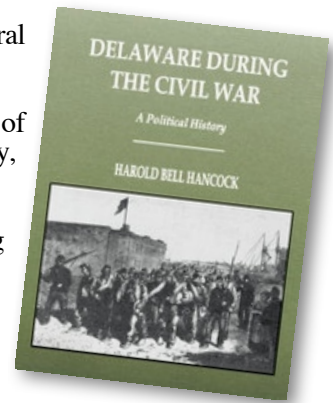

## Better Angels at the Court House this August

What happened in Delaware during the Civil War?

What were people thinking and feeling? What was it like to live throughout the American Civil War? "Better Angels" is an upcoming program sponsored by the Delaware Humanities Forum and several Delaware historical and theatrical societies that will answer these questions. "**Better Angels**" is a quartet of plays, created by Colin Adams-Toomey, that will allow you to relive the events leading up to and during the Civil War. These plays will explore the interesting experience Delaware had in the Civil War by giving the audience a close look at the difficult human choices that people were forced to make and deal with during that time. In the first play, **Signs of the Times**, we meet Thomas Garrett, John Hunn, Samuel Hawkins, and Judge Roger Taney in the legendary court case in which Garrett predicted the Civil War. "Better Angels" has been designed to bring the history of Delaware to life and open a window into the lives of Delawareans forced to take a stand, fight, and kill for their beliefs.

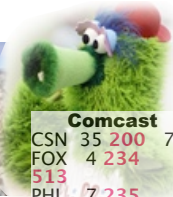

## Preservation Weekend August 4th and 5th

Saturday's program will feature Ken Darsney, a Horticulture Manager for DHCA, speaking at 10:30 a.m. about the potential adverse effects of trees and landscaping on historic buildings and sidewalks. At 1 p.m., Richard Byrne, Architectural Conservator, will discuss a building's overall health particularly as it relates to the effects of water. Both lectures in the **New Castle Court House Museum in Old New Castle** (211 Delaware St.) and include walking tours to point out examples. 10:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., Admission is \$20 per person; and free for members of Preservation Delaware; staff & members of Delaware's historic commissions; and local government officials.

Sunday from 1:30 to 4 p.m., the programs will focus on the historic district of New Castle. At 1:30 p.m. historian Brian Cannon will offer a presentation about a 1940s effort to make old New Castle a second Colonial Williamsburg including a plan to demolish post 1830s buildings in the historic area. Sally Monigle, chair of New Castle's Historic Area Commission, will talk about why historic districts are important and what it means to live in a historic district. Joan Larrivee, Delaware Tax Credit Program Manager, will then follow up with an explanation of the Tax Credit Program. Admission for Sunday's program is free for all registrants. Prior registration is required.

## ORIGINAL OLYMPIC GAMES

Olympic Games began over 2,700 years ago in Olympia, in southwest Greece.



The Games were part of a religious festival. The Greek Olympics, thought to have begun in 776 BC, inspired the modern Olympic Games (began in 1896). The Games were held in honour of Zeus, king of the gods, and were staged every four years at Olympia, a valley near a city called Elis. People from all over the Greek world came to watch and take part.

At the first one-day Olympic Games, the only event was a short sprint from one end of the stadium to the other. Gradually more events were added to make four days of competitions. They included wrestling, boxing, long jump, throwing the javelin and discus, and chariot racing. In the pentathlon, there were five events: running, wrestling, javelin, discus and long jump. One of the toughest events was the race for hoplites, men wearing armour and carrying shields.

Winners were given a wreath of leaves, and a hero's welcome back home. Winners might marry rich women, enjoy free meals, invitations to parties, and the best seats in the theatre.

The running track was much wider than a modern one. Twenty people could run at once. → [Olympic](#)

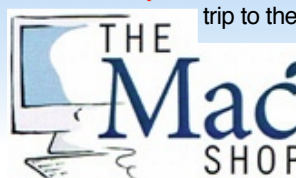

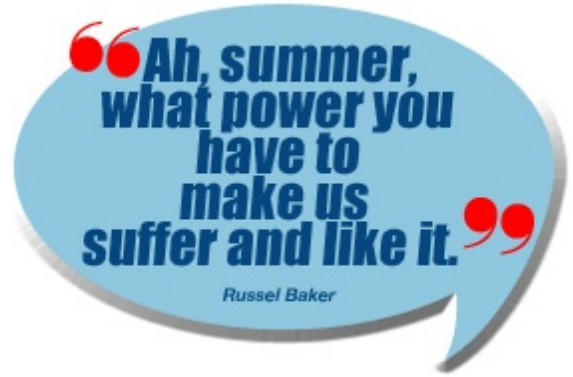
