Rare aircraft on tour arrive

at New Castle Airport

The National Wings of Freedom tour hits New Castle Airport Aug. 27 - 29 with a WWII Vintage Boeing B-17 Flying Fortress, Consolidated B-24 Liberator and North American P-51 Mustang.

The B-17 is one of only 10 in flying condition in the United States and the B-24J and Full Dual Control P-51C Mustang are the sole remaining examples of their type flying in the World.

Admission to explore the aircraft inside and out is \$12, \$6 for children younger than 12. WWII Veterans can tour for free. A 30-minute flight aboard the B-17 or B-24 is \$425 . P-51 flights are \$2,200 for a half hour. (Call [800] 568-8924).



Add the clams and mussels in their shells. Cover and cook until the shells open, 2-3

Bring 5 quarts of water and the remaining 5 tsps of salt to a boil in a large stockpot over high heat. Add the pasta and cook until tender. Transfer to a colander to drain.

Add the clams, mussels, shrimp and scallops to the tomato sauce, reserving about 6 of each for a garnish. Add the pasta to the tomato sauce and toss to coat well. Transfer to a platter and arrange the reserved seafood around the edges of the pasta.

Drizzle with the extra-virgin olive oil and sprinkle with the remaining parsley.




